#### SYLLABUS

## STUDY SKILLS I - NOTE TAKING AND MEMORY

Following is a brief outline of the assignments, readings and activities for this class. This schedule may be modified.

## Course Outline and Study Guide

CLASS 1: Course Outline and Study Guide.

What characteristics do successful students have? Are any of them useful outside of school, at home or at work? How can we develop these qualities?

CLASS 2: One Skill For Success: Note-Taking.

What are notes? What three processes go into taking notes? What are notes used for? What can I do <u>before</u> class to help me take better notes <u>in</u> class?

CLASS 3: Recording The Information.

What do I need to record? What do I not need to record? How do I record the information? What are some good ideas for taking notes?

- CLASS 4: Practice #1: Make notes from lecture. Individual and group practice.
  (Hand in for 10% of Term Mark)
- CLASS 5: Using Your Notes.

How much will I remember in 24 hours. Seven days? How can I use my notes to remember more? What is distributed learning?

CLASS 6: Practice #2: Make notes from a lecture. Individual and group practice.
(Hand in for 10% of Term Mark)

CLASS 7: Taking Notes From Books.

What is the SQ3R method? What do you <u>survey</u>? What do you <u>question</u>? What do you do as you <u>read</u>? What do you <u>recite</u>? When and how will you <u>review</u>?

CLASS 8: Practice #3: Using SQ3R. (Hand in for 10% of Term Mark)

CLASS 9: Memory:

How Do I Learn? How do I remember. Five principles of memory. How does my intention affect my ability to remember? Is it necessary to understand all the material? Are short, spaced sessions better than a long session? When does saturation occur? What is overlearning?

Practice #4: (Hand in for 10% of Term Mark)

CLASS 10: Mnemonics.

Group exercise on finding "tricks" to remember. What six mnemonic devices work best for me? Assignment #4. Choose five questions from this syllabus and answer them in complete sentences. (Due last class and worth 25% of Term Mark)

CLASS 11: Find Your Learning Path.

Assignment #5: Choose something that you do not know how to do but would like to learn. Describe it in <u>behavioral objectives</u>. Decide what activities you would need to do to meet those objectives. How will you evaluate when you have learned the activity? How will others evaluate you? Have this done in writing.

CLASS 12: Work Period

CLASS 13: Hand in Learning Activity (Assignment #5) when you demonstrate and explain your skill to the class. This is your final exam. Demonstration is worth 25% of Term Mark.

CLASS 14: As above. Final Exam - 20%. Quizzes throughout course - 15%.
