Course Description:

This is the second part of an introductory course in psychology. It presents an overview of the basic psychological processes with emphasis placed on the psychological experiences of the individual and their relationships with the group experiences. Specifically, this is an introduction to the study of human individuality, personality and social processes. Some aspects of normal and abnormal human behaviour, psychological assessment and treatment will be explored. The theoretical as well as the practical aspects of these processes will be addressed. By understanding the various psychological mechanisms that govern the various psychological processes you will have an appreciation for and an understanding of the field of Psychology and its various disciplines. This course, in conjunction with Psychology 1040, provides the foundation for more specific and advanced level courses in Psychology.
