MID-TERM EXAM

This exam will consist of 10-15 multiple choice questions from Chapters 14-17. The questions will be similar to those in the Study Guide.

There will be two essay questions. One will ask you to identify one topic covered and explain how it relates to Social Work. Your mark will be based on how well you explain the concept and relate it to the practice of Social Work.

The second essay question will be based on the Provocative Questions in the Study Guide.

FINAL EXAM

40%

This exam will consist of 10-15 multiple choice questions from Chapters 18-22. The questions will be similar to those in the Study Guide.

There will be two essay questions. One will ask you to write about a concept covered in this part of the course and relate it to Social Work. The second will ask you to describe one of the projects you completed, explain how it relates to a concept in the course, describe what you did, what you experienced or observed and the conclusions you drew from the project.
